CLINICAL SUPERVISOR: Santa Maria, Santa Barbara County

I. General Responsibilities

The Clinical Supervisor is responsible for the overall direction and implementation of the **Great Beginnings CPP (Child-Parent Program) and PEI (Prevention Early Intervention)** programs in Santa Maria and Lompoc, Santa Barbara County. This includes grant and contract compliance, as well as the coordination and clinical supervision of all home visitation and center-based services and staff. The Clinical Supervisor will be responsible for ensuring working conditions necessary to the therapeutic process, fiscal sustainability and overall success of the program. The Clinical Supervisor is also responsible for maintaining high team morale, demonstrating commitment to the values and philosophy of CALM and displaying leadership qualities that motivate and inspire others. This position reports to the Regional Manager, North SB County

II. Specific Responsibilities

- A. To provide weekly individual and group supervision to licensed, unlicensed therapists and para-professionals staff
- B. To carry a small caseload of clients
- C. To provide in-vivo mentoring or consultation to all staff if requested and as needed
- D. To plan and provide staff training and in-service activities
- F. To plan and supervise an efficient and responsive intake procedure, including determining prospective client eligibility for Great Beginnings CPP and PEI services and making case assignments
- G. To ensure high ethical/legal standards for all clinical practice, including the proper maintenance of client files.
- H. To ensure high clinical standards through keeping current in best practices for trauma-focused therapy, child-parent psychotherapy, early childhood mental health & special needs, developmental screening, home visitation and parent education and through making provision for staff training in these practices
- I. To be a member of the overall agency executive/management team developing administrative policy and practices.
- K. To interface with granting agencies/funders about grant and contract requirements and to ensure that all grant and contract requirements are met. To collaborate with the agency's grant writer to identify grant opportunities

- L. To interface with Alcohol, Drug and Mental Health services and ensure that CALM complies with the requirements of the Medi-Cal contract
- M. To participate in outreach activities and public relations to promote CALM programs and support on-going collaboration in the community
- N. To perform other duties as requested
